

## Speedwell Infant School

### Sports premium funding 2017/2018

Schools receive PE and sports premium funding based on the number of children in Y1 – Y6. Therefore, Speedwell Infant School receives funding based on the number of Y1 and Y2 children in school. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport offered.

The five key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across are:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skill of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport
