Maths

White Rose Maths Summer Term week 3 for year 1- learn about number bonds and talk about numbers in terms of their parts and the whole: whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/

I hope you have all collected your White Rose workbooks from school.

Practise counting on from different given numbers and practise learning number bonds to help you with quick mental addition

Linked to Jack and the Beanstalk, make paper, building blocks or recycling rubbish beanstalks. Who in your house can make the tallest? Can you measure them to see how tall they are?



Make some Giant footsteps on scrap paper and use them to measure your garden or your rooms. Perhaps you could borrow the shoes of the person in the house with the biggest feet so you could feel what it is like to walk like a Giant (ask first!)

Keep practising your counting and counting on in steps of 2,5 and 10

Literacy

The Week 3 story is Jack and the Beanstalk. If you have the story book you could read it with your family.

Could you draw the characters from this story to make some puppets? You could use the puppets to retell the story.

Write a new story where you are going on an adventure to the top of a beanstalk.

Remember- Capital letters- finger spaces - full stops

Write a recount of what Jack took from the Giant's castle using the time words we have practised at school. First Jack took a bag of gold. Then he took the....

Write a description of a Giant. Use lots of adjectives like huge, massive, smelly, disgusting etc.

Could you write a sorry letter from Jack to the Giant ?

Make a list of all the different kinds of beans you can think of. Can you find more than 10!!?

You could teach your family how to play the beans game we play in PE. Don't forget to Ooh La La for the French Beans.

Make sure you are still practising your reading and your phonics sounds.

Investigating and Creating

If you have any seeds at your house you could plant them and measure how they grow each day.



Could you find different materials to make a parachute for the Giant so that he doesn't get hurt when the beanstalk falls down? Use one of your toy figures to be the Giant.

If you can get some jelly bean sweets, you can use them to make a rainbow. Put them on a plate and pour over some water- watch what happens.
