

Speedwell Infant School

Sports premium funding 2020/2021, including evaluation of impact

Speedwell Infant School receives funding based on the number of Y1 and Y2 children in school. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport offered.

The five key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across are:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skill of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Due to Covid 19 restrictions it has not been possible to provide the full range of experiences, particularly the Little Leaders programme due to children needing to remain in class bubbles and participation in competitive sporting events with other schools. The £3,516 carried forward will be prioritised for such activities in the next academic year should restrictions be lifted.
